- Register for priority services in case of interruptions like power cuts. Certain groups like older people or those with young children can register for priority with utility providers if we have power cuts or other interruptions.

- More than 25 locations are registered as warm spaces across the area. These can be somewhere to go if you're cold at home or want somewhere with friendly faces.
