Town Council Tax (precept 21-22) to rise on average by 56p per month

Taking the results of the Town Council Tax survey we conducted late last year into account, and the estimated income the Council will receive due to the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic, the Town Council Tax (precept) level has been set at £1,293,034 for the 2021/22 financial year, an increase of £89,846 on last year's precept figure.

Approved at the Full Council meeting on 9 February, the precept level of a Band D property charge will increase from last year's figure of £112.88 to £119.65 in 2021/22; an increase of £6.79 per annum – 56p per month.

This will raise a total of £1,293,034, with the Council allocating £111,414 from its general reserve to support its 2020/21 expenditure.

Speaking at the Full Council meeting, Town Council

Leader Cllr Keith Baker said: "This pandemic has caused huge financial stresses for the Town Council and I would firstly like to thank the Town Clerk and her team of Council Officers for their diligence and determination to continue to provide an excellent service in what has been guite unmanageable circumstances.

"We responded to these financial challenges by asking local residents how much of an increase in the Town Council Tax they could accept. Unprecedented across the Borough, we received a response from one in five households and I would like to thank those who took part. 95.5% of the respondents accepted the lowest increase option, however, the Council has been able to keep the increase to less than a third of this at only 56p per month."

Woodley United FC fundraising success





Updates to maintenance yard



Under the current lockdown restrictions, the Oakwood Centre remains closed, however it will be used as an overflow centre for Covid 19 vaccines as and when required.

New recycling bags across the borough

Wokingham Borough Council is replacing the former black recycling boxes with new waterproof recycling bags to help with its target of 70 per cent recycling by 2030. The decision is in response to paper and card reprocessing plants no longer accepting wet materials. The waterproof recycling bags have a weight at the bottom to prevent them blowing away and are made of long-lasting materials, which should last for up to five years. They also weigh less than the black boxes, making handling easier. Please use the recycling bags as soon as you get them. If you need more than two bags, please use your black boxes initially, but only for non-paper/card items such as cans, tins and plastics.
