# Report of a virtual meeting of the Cycling & Walking Task & Finish Working Group held on Friday 7 May 2024 at 12.30pm

#### 1. APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN

Following a proposal, it was

#### **RESOLVED:**

◆ To appoint Councillor Taylor as the Chairman of the committee for the remainder of the 2023/24 municipal year.

#### 2. APOLOGIES

There were no apologies for absence.

#### 3. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest made by Members.

#### 4. MEETING – 8 FEBRUARY 2024

Members noted the report of the committee's meeting held on 8 February 2024, as provided in the agenda.

#### 5. WBC REPRESENTATIVES

Alison Flawith – My Journey, Wokingham Borough Council (WBC) – attended the meeting to provide details of WBC's current active travel plans.

Alison highlighted the planned active travel route between Charvil Piggot School and Twyford Station. It was noted WBC had made a couple of unsuccessful bids for funding, with the project estimated to cost between £3-5million. Alison suggested more local support might help aid funding bids. It was confirmed this would be a segregated cycle route, with local flooding taken into account in the design.

It was noted that the Town Council previously recommended this route link up with Woodley, enabling through travel to Twyford Station. Members felt, whilst cycling along Beggars Hill Road was relatively safe, this was less so when joining Waingels Road. It was commented that better signage of the safest routes was needed.

Alison raised the Woodlands Avenue active travel route design, advising that Active Travel England funding, allocated to support this scheme, had to be used on this or an alternative route along Beechwood Avenue. Funding could not be transferred to a different scheme, and if it was not spent the funding would be lost. It was noted the Town Council had not been advised of the alternative design along Beechwood Avenue, a route which Councillors and members of the public had asked WBC to evaluate early in 2023.

Alison advised that the designed schemes were for specific sections of the active travel routes contained in the LCWIP; implementation of the entire LCWIP was a longer term, 15-year plan. Members requested a link to overall LWCIP be circulated.

Helen Littler joined the meeting.

Alison advised WBC had successfully bid for CCIF funds to provide 8 secure cycle lockers at Twyford Station. The lockers, bookable and accessible via an app, are provided on a lease basis at a cost of £15k for a 5-year period. Following a suggestion that Earley Station might be a good location for such lockers, Alison advised this was more difficult as National Rail own the land surrounding the station, whilst WBC own the car park at Twyford. Alison suggested WBC could work with the Town Council to seek funding via the Spoke Safe Network for lockers, if the Council wished to support the provision of these in the area.

It was noted that WBC had installed a bike maintenance stand at Bulmershe Leisure Centre. It was suggested the provision of secure cycle lockers and / or a maintenance stand at the front of the Oakwood Centre might be suitable. With regards to cycle lockers, Alison advised the Town Council would be responsible for ensuring these are suitably maintained, but major issues, such as major vandalism or breakages, would be sorted by WBC.

Alison advised that WBC were looking to update cycle route maps for the area. Following discussions with disability groups, it has been agreed to continue to provide these in hard copy, as well as digitally. It was noted WBC could work with the Town Council to ensure maps were as accurate as possible when highlighting the safest and most appropriate routes. Alison suggested she could provide table sized maps of the area, on which suitable cycle routes could be highlighted. It was also suggested a session could be held at the Oakwood Centre for the public to feed into this.

Once maps are produced, it was noted it would be possible to consider where signage was needed, as well as reviewing other suitable infrastructure updates. Alison advised that the aim was to produce new maps in the coming months, with budget assigned to do so in the current financial year.

Alison informed members that WBC would be piloting a School Streets scheme in September. This was originally offered to Beechwood School who, following analysis, had been identified as a school with higher levels of car usage, however Beechwood did not take up the offer. Karen Robertson advised she worked regularly with schools in Woodley and would be able to help identify which are more engaged with promoting cycling initiatives.

Alison advised that WBC would be running a Beat the Street game in Woodley from 5 June to 17 July. The game requires people to visit boxes, attached to lampposts and other infrastructure around the area, and gain points for each they access. Scores are registered and collated for individuals, or by school or community group, with prizes then awarded. The aim of the game is to encourage active travel; when previously run in a different area of the Borough, WBC tracked a 60% increase in active travel.

Alison advised that random prizes can be assigned to boxes to be awarded on specific days, with random individuals who accesses the box winning the corresponding prize. Alison suggested the Town Council might consider providing prizes, advising that prizes such as leisure centre memberships had been awarded in other areas. WBC would need to be advised within the next 2-3 weeks if this were to be the case.

Finally, Alison advised members of the Love to Ride scheme, highlighting that May is Bike month, with organisations able to take part and compete with others to achieve the highest number of miles travelled by bike.

Following a query, Alison confirmed that businesses can borrow one of WBC's cargo bikes to help promote the use of bikes as a means of business transport.

The Deputy Town Clerk asked Alison to ensure he and the Council's Communications Manager are included in communications from WBC's MyJourney team, and that the Council will happily promote initiatives which are of benefit to Woodley residents.

Karen, Alison and Helen left the meeting.

#### 6. ACTIONS & TASKS

It was noted that the working group would need to consider actions in line with the terms of operation set out in the group's terms of reference.

The Deputy Town Clerk highlighted that the working group's terms of reference included an expected end date of their activities as 22 May 2024, and that the group would need to recommend an extension if, as was apparent, they would not achieve their objectives by this date.

It was acknowledged that there had been little discussion on walking at the meeting. Steve Vale commented that there was little resource for introducing new walking infrastructure in Woodley, but that focus should be given to what is there. It was highlighted again that better signage was required, but that assessing appropriate routes was the first steps. It was suggested that the group might, as with the cycling routes, mark on a large map of the area the most suitable and safe walking routes, although it was noted this should focus on active travel and not walking for leisure purposes. Steve advised that Loddon Valley Ramblers would be able to help with this.

Members discussed how long they felt they needed to undertake this work, and to meet the other terms of operation contained in the terms of reference, and suggested an extension of the group for one year. It was also noted that the group would need to consider how to measure the success of their work.

#### **RESOLVED:**

◆ For WBC's MyJourney team to provide the working group with two large, table top sized maps of Woodley, on which the group, with suitable engagement from the public, will work to identify the safest, most suitable active cycling and walking routes (a separate map for each).

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

 That the Planning & Community Committee amend the terms of reference for the working group to extend the end date from 22 May 2024 until the end of May 2025.
